Clarification of changes to the Constitution Policies & Procedures. It was indicated to all attendees that there had it had previously been possible for volunteer staff members to be elected to the Management Committee while paid staff members were ineligible to be elected. This meant that staff could be their own boss (on the Management Committee) and that staff members could ultimately manage the organisation's managers and co-ordinators while being under their supervision on a day-to-day basis.

The Management Committee amended this policy to ensure that no staff member, whether paid or volunteer, could be on staff and on the Committee. It was explained to attendee that any VGC volunteer was eligible to stand for the Committee but, in the event they were successful in being elected they would have to forgo their volunteer staff post. The Returning Officer for the electoral process explained this process for Nomination and Election to the meeting in detail.

- Successful Seniors Week opening event attended by the Ambassador for Ageing.

Managers' Report

This financial year has seen further developments and recognition for Volunteering Gold Coast in all 3 key business areas – transport services, arts and entertainment services and volunteering services. We continue to develop our reputation and we have increased our funding through growth funds and discretionary projects from funding bodies. There are numerous areas that we believe have made us such a successful organisation in the 2009 /10 financial year – we have developed a highly committed, dedicated and capable staff of approx 120 people who have shared our vision and business goals. We continue to have excellent leadership from the Management Committee as well as the co-ordinators at the Transport office, the Arts and Entertainment Services the Volunteering Services and staff within the administration team. We are excelling in working in areas that are at the forefront of the not-for-profit sector. This includes the HACC Transport Consortium, the A and E area and we are now the largest volunteer resource centre in Australia.

Achievements

There has once again been some stand out highlights across our organisation (please don't forget to look at the major achievements of VGC in the Annual Report):

- Outstanding work by the Transport Services and the HACC Gold Coast Transport Consortium - still the only community transport consortium of its type in Australia. We have been paid a massive compliment securing two additional amounts of funding that have seen our HACC Trips targets increased from 32,000 to 81,000.
- We secured the Bundall Park and Ride Shuttle Service – carrying workers in the CBD in a project funded by Gold Coast City Council. We have had substantial increases in our outputs and we have secured each area of business.
- A jewel in our crown was undoubtedly the Cancer Patient Service with 3 buses being donated by GCCC and supporters of Monique Clarke – the Mayor's daughter who was herself a victim of cancer.
- The Yatala Workers Shuttle bus service is now supported by the DEEDI, the Westpac Bank and Volunteering Gold Coast. This service supports workers travelling to the industrial areas in Beenleigh, Yatala and Eagleby.
- Work with Alternate Education Providers, Miami High School, TAFE colleges, universities and other education facilities have assisted high school and tertiary students.
- A fifth excellent audit outcome in a row! Simone Ault, our Treasurer Joy-Anne Fisher, Ian Barfoot and other members of the Finance Sub-Committee are to be commended on their sound work – our projects and programs have grown by around substantially and managing the budget has been a continual challenge, especially with funding coming front left and right throughout the year!
- Continued recognition from FaHCSIA, HACC, Gold Coast City Council, DEEDI and Education Queensland has focused on our work in community development and volunteering.
- Volunteering services and the marketing and promotion of VGC have continued to build and grow. This has seen VGC attract some high quality staff to work and promotions.
- Extremely good links have been maintained with all 3 levels of government – with the Federal, State and Local governments all providing funding to us in the last year.
- Approved provider for the Golden Guru program from Department of Education Employment Workplace Relations (DEEWR).

Business Development

Business development continues as well focus on our Strategic Plan. We have terrific support from our funding bodies that have assisted us with both our Strategic Plan and our Marketing Plan. These plans and our budget have enabled us to speculate and pursue our eight themes of business. At this time we continue with success in five of our areas of business development. We wish to both thank and congratulate the Management Committee for their vision, commitment and dedication in the areas of business development. It is one thing to have ideas and intent it is another thing to bring ideas to reality – those who have witnessed our Management Committee’s work are unanimous in their praise for their work – we are blessed!

Finally, and importantly, we would like to thank all of the wonderful staff across all of the services at Volunteering Gold Coast – in Volunteering Services, Transport Services and Arts and Entertainment Services as well as the Management Committee. Everyone has dedicated their time and ability which has embellished our capacity to deliver quality programs and projects onto the Gold Coast. I have not singled out any staff member or Management Committee member as I believe we have been blessed with a team in which every member contributes equally their skills, knowledge and enthusiasm to create the dynamic synergy of Volunteering Gold Coast.

As the Business Manager, new to the organization this year, it is an extreme delight to be welcomed into the team. It gives me immense satisfaction and enjoyment to contribute to the wider community, working with a talented, dedicated and passionate team.

As the VGC General Manager I have been extremely lucky to more than 120 staff who share our plans. Over the last five years we have grown from a paid staff of four to 46 and a volunteer team of 15 to a total of 70 volunteers - located in two locations – Tugun and Surfers Paradise. It is also worth noting that the last five years has also seen us move from a turnover of \$300,000 to in excess of \$2million. The challenges and changes that has become part of our daily business are certain to continue to challenge us into 2011!

Volunteering Services Report

We are certainly blessed and feel so honoured in managing such a wonderful team. We have continued to deliver services to a very high standard. We can't thank staff enough for their positive attitude and insight into the outputs of the business. We have seen VGC emerging into a more professional and efficient organisation thanks to the fantastic volunteer and paid staff.

Recently we have seen the development of a new orientation manual and program thanks to Susan Solakovic who has done an induction of volunteers in the new program. We are also pleased to have new systems and procedures put into place as we have seen our customers serviced to greater levels.

We have forged greater connections with our member organisations and many of them come in for visits throughout the year. We have developed a Membership Team that has helped with maintaining relevant and current information on our members. The Volunteer Managers' Network Meetings have seen an increase in attendance since the introduction of guest speakers.

The database has proved to be a great asset as we have been able to adjust it to suit our needs and have been able to make intricate changes which help with reporting and statistics. We have also been very fortunate to have Russell Moran on the team and he has developed a database that is specific to events and has been very useful to the Arts & Entertainment Services.

We have also had a very dedicated and wonderful team of volunteers who time and again have put up their hands to man the various stalls we have had around the Gold Coast - a special thanks to the "V – Team" for going above and beyond the call of duty! This has been great as we have participated in 12 events, providing information booths that have allowed us to reach a larger audience. We have new volunteers with different skills sets which has enriched our team to no end. The whole team has done a magnificent job this past year. A massive "thank you" to all of them! Thank you for your dedication, enthusiasm and loyalty. The "family" atmosphere you create is highly regarded by new staff and it is for this reason that we have been able to make a mark on our community.

There has been a greater than expected increase in memberships this past year. We have received new organisation memberships (does not include individual memberships), bringing our membership base to 332.

Marketing report

There was a high level of success in the promotions, marketing and resource centre area for VGC in the 2009-2010 period. We have found that people from all sectors were more aware of VGC and our services and were keen to support and link in with us. We have gained a few very valuable partners and achieved greater recognition for members of the VGC team that has been a great inspiration to us all. We have been approached to take on extra projects by various partners including council and local government departments. We have gained a reputation as a "go to" team and we have reached the status as a leading authority on volunteering.

SUCSESSES IN 2009 – 2010

EVENTS: The events that we ran were very successful and we have formed many valuable alliances with an array of sponsors who continue to support us to date. I would like to thank the Arts and Entertainment Services for the very professional and hugely successful events they have organised this year which brought VGC recognition. We were also able to attract more public support and member organisations from the events we ran during the last year. The International Volunteers' Day Awards were enjoyed by all and we were thrilled that The Federal Government saw it as a leading event in the volunteering community and approached us to launch their Golden Gurus Program at our IV Day Awards. This year we tried something a little different for National Volunteers Week and this was which was very successful - we held an appreciation event for our volunteers at Qdeck. This was a considerable investment for the organisation but it has paid off in being able to show VGC's appreciation to the volunteers that are the backbone of the organisation.

ALLIANCE WITH MEDIA: This continues to improve each year with continuing support from the Gold Coast Sun Newspaper. They were a major media sponsor of the International Volunteers' Day event running editorials for the lead up to the event and also after the event. Hot Tomato and Gold FM have also been great support and they have responded to all press releases we have sent out. We have had quite a number of articles in the local paper in three areas of business, TS, ET & VGC. A huge thanks to Liezl Reinecke who joined the team, initially as a volunteer, and then transposed into a full time paid role. She proved to be a wonderful asset and fitted in with the team before leaving to take up a post at Bond Uni.

PARTNERSHIPS: The parties that would be involved in this are; Job Services Australia Providers, Centrelinks, Members of Parliament, Sponsors, Businesses, media, Councillors & community organizations. This has proved to be vital in our activities last year and we need to continue to initiate and maintain these partnerships in greater measure this year. Forming these partnerships and relationships will open up areas for us that otherwise we would not normally access.

EVENTS, EXPO'S: We have proved that we have the capability to run very professional and successful events and are seen as the leader in organising community events, not only in the promotion of volunteering as a whole, but also to support our member organisations.

TRAINING: there has been an increase this year in training attendance and we put this down to the fact the we have had a few different workshops we have offered and also that we have had the membership officers follow-up with our organisations. We have also been active in contacting the organizations in regard to the array of services we offer. This has occurred through the new initiative implemented this year – the membership officers. The uptake and popularity of training has also been driven by the addition of the Colour Spectrum training and in this regard a huge thank you to John Muller for his dedication and enthusiasm in introducing the Colour Spectrum workshops. These sessions proved to be greatly popular in bringing much acclaim to VGC.

Both the Volunteering Services and the Marketing team look forward to the challenges that lie ahead for us in 2010!

Financial Report

Yet again we find ourselves at the end of another successful financial year! As in previous years, the growth of the organisation has far surpassed the expectations of us all! As well as continuing our existing services with our main funding body, Disability Services Queensland (HACC). We also feel very fortunate to continue the projects and services with our other wonderful contributors; FaHCSIA, Gold Coast City Council, DEIR, EID&I and Education Queensland, to name but a few!

The invaluable funding has allowed Volunteering Gold Coast to provide Volunteer Recruitment, Training & Placement, Community Events, and Transportation to many members of the Gold Coast and extended Community. In addition it has also enabled VGC to provide and manage projects such as the Yatala Work Initiative Bus, Cancer Patients Bus, Golden Idol Talent Quest, Q150 and Eat Well Be Active Program.

Thus giving us the opportunity to provide services to a greater number of deserving people, and give a broader spectrum of projects and services - extending beyond the core services previously provided by Volunteering Gold Coast. On the financial front, as you can imagine it has been very busy! As the projects keep coming in, so does the workload! To make sure that we maintain and continue to improve our accounting acumen, we have appointed a new staff member to the Accounts Department. Sarah Hornabrook our Accounts Assistant, joined Volunteering Gold Coast in January of this year, and has proved herself to be a very diligent and integral member of our team. I would like to make a special thanks to Sarah, as without her assistance during this time, my sanity certainly would have been compromised! As in previous years, I will not bore you all with all the details of the year that was. Instead I have provided a snapshot of key elements that you may find interesting:

Synopsis of the year that was.....

- The total income for 2009-2010 was nearly \$1.9M. That is an increase in over 40% from the previous financial year!
- Of that funding over \$1.2M was state funding which is 63%, Local Funding 11%, Federal Funding 4%.
- Total paid staff for 2009-2010 was 44. Up over 30% for last year - and this does not take into account the wonderful volunteers that donate their time and services!
- Our General Ledger has been given a "facelift" and is now inline with the "Not for Profit" accounts that is used by major government bodies.
- We now have a staggering 18 vehicles in the Volunteering Gold Coast Fleet!
- Many employees are now taking advantage of the CBB Salary Sacrifice opportunity, offered only to employees of the "Not for Profit" Sector!

Please take a moment to view the following audit report and financial statements for a more detailed account of the 2009-2010 financial year. Thanks to all the brilliant staff, volunteers, management committee, funding partners and general community, because without all their hard work, support and smiles, we could not have achieved the positive and successful result that we did! Here's to another successful financial year and exciting future!

Transport Services Report

Volunteering Gold Coast Transport Services.

It's hard to believe that Transport Services team has increased from 39 staff and drivers in 2009 to 71 in 2010. I recall in last year's report saying that we were "*building an empire*", well, it certainly looks like we are heading in the right direction! The growth in administration staff has made it necessary to take up additional office space in the adjoining office next door. Some days we have 10 people working in the office! I am very proud of the services that our wonderful drivers and staff are providing.

Our fleet of vehicles has also doubled from last year to 17 vehicles, all being used to full capacity to keep up with the demand for transport. The average number of kilometres travelled each week for these vehicles is in excess of 14,000.

Our new HACC targets for the **Gold Coast Transport Consortium** are HUGE! Although we have not yet reached them we are positive that with consultation, networking between members and hard work, we will come close. Apr-Jun 2010 client numbers achieved were 1180 (target 1423) and trips achieved 13,220 (target 16729).

Our community circuit services continue to be a huge success with at least 7 vehicles operating on a daily basis to get clients out and about and to appointments. Social group outings to various destinations for clients are also proving a big success. We regularly receive thank you letters from clients wishing to express their gratitude to our drivers. Most of our clients would not be able to access community services would be socially isolated if these services were not available to them. It is very rewarding for everyone in the team when one of these thank you cards or letters comes into our office.

Driver training sessions are now being held on a monthly basis due to the increased 'drivers pool'. Individual driver assessments are now in place for all drivers. Consortium members are also utilising VGC drivers when their own drivers are on leave or if they are short of volunteer drivers. We now have 51 male drivers and 10 female drivers.

Our profile continues to grow within the community and our branded vehicles are now being widely recognised throughout the Gold Coast. We were honoured to be approached by The Gold Coast Mayor (GCCC) to provide the new **Cancer Treatment Transport Service** which commenced late Dec 09. This service commenced with one vehicle "Monique's Bus" to transport people who were having difficulty accessing their oncology departments for treatment. This service has also increased due to two more vehicles being purchased through additional fund raising events and donations. We now have Monique 1, 2 & 3 vehicles providing this much needed service. We currently have 196 people registered for this service. *Launch and blessing of the 2 additional buses held 29th July at Budds beach. Press release was produced by GCCC' Robyn Holland on the additional services.*

The Council Cab Shopping service continues to transport between 70-80 people each Thursday to their local shopping centre. Most of these clients are using our community circuit service to assist them to get out and about on other days including weekends.

The **Yatala Workers Shuttle** received \$5,000 funding from Westpac Bank. The signage was changed on the bus to 'Westpac Workers Shuttle. A special thanks to Ken Glennie (afternoon driver) who has been driving the shuttle bus since it started for filling in whilst we had our morning driver on sick leave.

Welcome also to Paula Milburn who has commenced the morning shift on this service, replacing Ernie Wiese who resigned last month. This service is providing transport to approximately 60 people each day enabling them to get to their employers in the Yatala Industrial area. *Press release in Albert and Logan Newspaper 23rd June on Westpac's funding towards the shuttle service.*

The **Bundall Park N Ride** Shuttle buses transport approx 2140 people per month. VGC purchased a 21 seater coaster to provide the am shuttle. This bus is also being used for social outings for community groups, HACC transport and bus brokerage.

Students continue to be assisted with bus passes to access alternative educational facilities though **Ed Queensland** funding. Positive Learning Centre, Scisco and Ridgeway TAFE accessing travel passes at present. Schools/ PCYC 's also use our drivers to assist them in transporting students to educational trips or recreational outings.

I don't think I need to list our achievements over the past year as the services provided by our wonderful drivers and staff speaks for itself. We assist many community groups and organisations on the Gold Coast to get their members, clients and carers to various destinations on the Gold Coast. We will continue to support our community members who are transport disadvantaged and make their journey with our services as comfortable and pleasurable as possible though our dedicated volunteer and paid drivers.

I feel honoured to work with a great team of professional staff, volunteers and drivers. Each one of you contributes so much to make this service a success. I thank you all for your continued dedication to VGC Transport Services and look forward to working with you all in 2011.

A special thank you to Richard, The Management Committee, June Wells and Josephine Jones for their encouragement and tremendous support over the past year.

Arts & Entertainment Services Report



The Arts and Entertainment Services has again enjoyed a successful year. We have had on-going bookings to community organizations and events throughout the year with performers promoting VGC on a weekly basis. We have also had excellent concerts at Christmas, for National Volunteers' Week, International Volunteers' Day, Seniors' Week and for the VGC Christmas party.

We have also had two terrific Golden Idol events – in 2009 and 2010, with wonderful support from Cr Dawn Critchlow, GCCC and great attendances from the Gold Coast community. Up to 600 people attended these events over the 3 Heats and Grand Final which was also the launch of Seniors Week celebrations on the Gold Coast in 2010. Mayor Ron Clarke officially opened the proceedings with guest speakers John Paul Langbroek LNP Leader, June Wells, HACC Area Manager, and Ambassador for Ageing, actor & comedienne, Noeline Brown.

The Prim Hill Award for outstanding community work was held in association with the Seniors Week Committee. This award was presented to Marianne Gevers. This linked the official opening with the Grand Final and created a bigger picture atmosphere. We anticipate that this will continue next year as the Golden Idol is now an important event on the Seniors Week calendar. It also needs to be noted that there are three funding applications for 2011 events being processed by the relevant funding bodies - some of these relate to Seniors' Week in 2011!

VOICES IN HARMONY CHOIR (SINGING WORKSHOP)

This was a project initiated by Arts & Entertainment to try and support Transport Services clients who are over 50's. Unfortunately this did not reap the levels of support we had hoped for and we resorted to other avenues to include the general public.

Rehearsals were held over 15 weeks culminating in a very successful concert. A questionnaire was introduced to initiate a general research project which would be pertinent to this event for the Gold Coast. The Arts & Entertainment department is totally run by volunteers as funding is not available to continue June Eadie's Booking Officer role.

The department has excellent volunteers in terms of staffing consisting of a graphic artist, web designer, media executive, plus other folk with terrific skills - which is why we have been successful in creating, developing and presenting a range of events. I have been very fortunate to have such a dedicated team to support myself and the A & E projects and I feel very fortunate to be able to have such a terrific role in support the volunteering cause on the Gold Coast through a terrific group of entertainers. We look forward to the year ahead!
